FEEDBACK FROM CLIENTS ONE YEAR AFTER LEAVING TREATMENT CENTER

Looking back at your stay at Apollo Treatment Center, what elements of their program were particularly effective at helping you remain clean and sober after leaving?

The one-on-one therapy was really helpful in terms of understanding what was driving me to drink to lethal levels.

I've stayed in touch with most of the guys in my section, and they've really helped me when I've been struggling.

Jason was a fabulous counselor. I always knew he really cared & could see through my b.s.

What do you think Apollo Treatment Center could have done better to help prepare you for a life of sobriety?

It would have been nice if I could have reached out to any of my counselors when the cravings struck. I felt like I had built a really solid relationship with Karen, and suddenly I had no way to contact her.

Apollo recommended I go to a half-way house for at least six months, but we couldn't afford it, so I can't really blame them that I relapsed soon after leaving. Perhaps if they had helped me find some cheaper options, I could have avoided those 3 months of hell.
